

La Féerie des Glaces will light up Mont-Tremblant



The 2010 edition of the Mont-Tremblant Féerie des Glaces, presented by the Caisse populaire Desjardins de Mont-Tremblant, will celebrate the magic of winter from February 19 to March 7. The event will feature ice and snow sculptures carved by sculptors from all over the world, day and night live entertainment, a wide range of sports activities such as broomball, snowshoe rallies and cross-country skiing, as well as a huge number of activities for all ages.

Moving out of the town centre this year, the event will take place at a new, much bigger location right next to the Mont-Tremblant arena, on Cadieux Street, just a few minutes from downtown. The new

space will have two lighted skating rinks, ice slides, an ice labyrinth and a massive ice wall measuring 100 feet wide by 25 feet high. The other main attraction on the new site will be an ice palace, complete with an illuminated ice bar. Also new this year is the addition of activities being offered at sites in the Old Village, at Lac Mercier and on the skating rink by the Saint-Bernard chapel at the Tremblant resort.

The official opening will take place Friday, February 19, with a 5 to 7 opening cocktail party at the ice bar featuring a live DJ, to be followed on the 20th with the first full day of events. Ice sculpture workshops, a puppet show, musical show, dogsledding and the first of three spectacular Fire and Ice shows will all be part of the line-up. While the main events will take place on the weekend, the downtown site will be open to the general public during the week of March 1st to March 5th. The site will be reserved exclusively for school groups from the 22nd to the 26th, with activities, games and contests that are sure to offer an unforgettable experience to local students.
